JBC Donation Will Pay For Forest Preserve Repair Stations



Forest Preserve District of Will County officials accept a \$3,500 donation from the Joliet Bicycle Club during the Forest Preserve Board meeting on Dec. 12. A \$3,500 donation from the <u>Joliet Bicycle Club</u> will pay for two Forest Preserve District of Will County bike repair stations at preserve trailheads.

One station will be installed along the <u>Rock Run Greenway Trail</u> in Rock Run Preserve – Paul V. Nichols access at Ingalls Avenue and Essington Road in Joliet. The other location has yet to be determined.

The bicycle club's representatives, Vice President Dominick Chellino and Treasurer Conrad Brouwer, presented the donation check to the Forest Preserve at the December 12 Board of Commissioners meeting.

Each repair station will consist of an air pump and bike repair tools, including screwdrivers and wrenches, attached to a post with stainless steel cables. Hanger arms on the stand will allow bicyclists to hang their bikes during repairs. Bicyclists who experience mechanical issues while riding on Forest Preserve trails will be able to use the tools to repair their bikes.

"They come in very handy and they're very popular," said Ralph Schultz, the Forest Preserve's chief operating officer.

The bicycle club raises money each year with a Fourth of July Century Ride.

"We always try to give back to our communities, and this year, we're giving back a little over \$10,000 (overall)," Chellino said.

Forest Preserve trails are becoming more and more popular with club members, he said.

"For a lot of us, we do a lot of road riding," he explained. "But, as the county is getting more and more congested, we're using the trails to connect to some of the roads to get out into the country and less traveled roads."

The trails also are a safer option when riding with kids or grandkids, he added.

The club also has paid for bike repair stations on the <u>Old Plank Road</u>

<u>Trail</u> in Frankfort and along the section of the Rock Run Greenway Trail that is part of the Joliet Junior College campus. According to Brouwer, all of the cables and tools at these stations are still intact.

"The one in Frankfort has been there for six or seven years and all of the tools are still there," he said.



2020 Membership Update—Steve Geary, Membership Chair

For all those great people who have already renewed their JBC Membership for 2020, I Thank You. No future action is needed. Just get on your bike and ride.

For all those who have <u>not</u> renewed yet, your 2019 Membership will expire today. As of January 1, 2020 you will no longer receive any more reminders. In fact, you will no longer be receiving any emails via JBC Google Groups.

Not to worry, you can become a member of JBC at anytime during the year. Just simply fill out a <u>Membership Application</u> and pay a \$16 fee using <u>PayPal</u>.

Please Note: As of the 2020 fiscal year, JBC Memberships have gone paperless.

What does this mean? JBC is no longer accepting paper applications. We no longer accept cash or checks as a form of payment. Every member renewal or new member must fill out a Membership and use PayPal to submit a membership fee.

What does this mean for you? No more paper applications to print. No longer will you need to write a check and send it to a PO Box. Using the paperless method, your membership and payment are nearly instantaneous. No more waiting for your check to be processed. What does this mean for JBC? **Accountability!** Your membership application is recorded into the database immediately. Notifications are sent to the Membership Chair and the Treasurer immediately. Your payment is transferred and recorded immediately. tion is needed. Just get on your bike and ride.



- SG Show & Go ride leaders, and distances can be decided at the ride Ride contacts are to be called for information about the ride.
- S Social Group stays together, rides at posted level, has ride leader. All riders should plan to arrive at any scheduled ride at least 10 minutes before the scheduled departure time.

AD HOC RIDES

- 1. A non-calendar ride, via google groups email invite
- 2. 12 hour advance notice, e.g. Friday 8am ride invite sent by 8pm Thursday
- 3. Invite must include starting time, location and ride level (I-V)
- 4. Additional details about the ride can be shared too.
- 5. Miles are recorded as: AH/date/leader initials/miles/riders (in alpha form).
- 6. Use AD Hoc number assigned to the day of the ride
- 7. 2 riders minimum for instate rides and 3 riders minimum for out of state rides
