Google Groups:

Google Groups is a list-server for the Joliet Bicycle Club where all members are able to post information regarding activities relating to JBC and/or biking in general.

General Guidelines:

- Please maintain civility and think about what you post. All articles posted are to be in good taste.
- All posts must reflect your full name.
- There will be ABSOLUTELY NO denigration of an individual or a group of individuals.
- There will be no tolerance for vitriolic or


- cynical commentary about the club or its members.
- There will be no posts regarding business issues pertaining to the club. All business issues must be presented at a general meeting.
- Posts related to charitable Invitationals and donations are to be brought before the board or at a general meeting first.

Abusers of these policies will be warned once and then temporarily removed from Google Groups. Repeat offenders will be permanently removed. Decisions regarding these policies will be determined and ruled on by the board.






Click the picture to the right to review the January 2023 Publication of the Illinois Bicycle Rules of the Road.

JBC Ride Definitions / Rules / Etiquette

SG - Show & Go - ride leaders, and distances can be decided at the ride

S - Social - Group stays together, rides at posted level, has ride leader.

Ride contacts are to be called for information about the ride.

All riders should plan to arrive at any scheduled ride at least 10 minutes before the scheduled departure time.

AD HOC RIDES

- 1. A non-calendar ride, via google groups email invite
- 2. 12 hour advance notice, e.g. Friday 8am ride invite sent by 8pm Thursday
- 3. Invite must include starting time, location and ride level (I-V)
- 4. Additional details about the ride can be shared too.
- 5. Miles are recorded as: AH/date/leader initials/miles/riders (in alpha form).
- 6. Use AD Hoc number assigned to the day of the ride
- 7. 2 riders minimum for in-state and out of state rides
